Important Notes for Participants:

- Entry forms, photos, and entry fees must be received by March 15th.
 All entry fees support Pasco Audubon's conservation projects.
- Contest winners will be announced **April 6th** during our season-ending monthly talk with special guest speaker **Kirsten Hines** a Florida-based author, wildlife photographer, and conservationist with a master's degree in biology and a background as an environmental educator. Her topic will be: **Conservation Photography: Using your Images for a Greater Good**
- Best of Show prize of \$100 and other cash prizes for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in each category will be awarded. Categories this year include **Bird**, **Nature** (non-bird), **Best Photo taken in Starkey Park**, and **Conservation**.

All proceeds from the Pasco Audubon annual photo contest fund our local conservation initiatives. Past proceeds have helped fund construction of our bird blind at Grassy Lake; Bluebird, Kestrel, and Wood Duck nesting boxes; the refurbishment of the park's native plant garden; and development of "birding backpacks" (binos, field guides, and such for adults and children) to be available for check out at our local libraries.

In addition, we support a growing Conservation Leadership Initiative (CLI) program, in which we partner with college undergraduate students to introduce them to Audubon's mission and goals. In return they help us reach the next generation of conservation leaders. Our former CLI students' projects ranged from conducting research on the relationship between water level and lake use by species of concern here at Starkey Park, to research on how prescribed burns help our Bachman's Sparrows, to the development of a program specifically designed to recruit and engage young adults in our chapter.

We sincerely hope you join us this year in celebrating and sharing Tampa Bay's natural wonders.
