November 18th: Field Trip to Lake Apopka Wildlife Drive

Lake Apopka Wildlife Drive is located in Orange County, and is one of the top birding destinations in Florida. While it is quite a long drive to get to, it has some birds not usually seen in Pasco including Fulvous Whistling-ducks and Gray-headed Swamphen. Huge numbers of ducks and other waterfowl can be viewed at much closer quarters and in far greater numbers than are typically seen.

The site is an 11-mile drive with a speed limit of 10 miles per hour, and lots of pull-overs to facilitate viewing and photography. If you decide to join us for this expedition, please bring your lunch and beverages with you (there is nothing to purchase in the park and not much in the surrounding area either). The park does have basic restrooms. With the drive taking the best part of two hours each way and planning for 3-4 hours making our way around, it is best to think of this as an all-day trip.

Meet us at the location. Once you drive through the gate of the property, pull over and wait at the rest area that is 100 yards or so inside the gate. We will set off from this location at **8am**. For those arriving early there is great birding in that first stretch from the gate to the rest area. Questions? Contact me at president@pascoaudubon.com.

Honeymoon Island Field Trip – Report By Christine Rowland

On October 21st, 18 of us visited Honeymoon Island. We spent time on the south beach – walking south of the main Pavilion, and then walked Osprey Trail, finishing up behind the Nature Center. We saw 44 species of birds, and our list with photos can be viewed at https://ebird.org/checklist/S152764323. Highlights included good opportunities to view Wilson's Plovers and Piping Plovers on the beach. Piping plovers are endangered and a red watch list species, with a continental concern rating of 18 out of 20. The global breeding population is only 8,400 individuals. So we were very happy to find 3 of them on the beach – none of them banded! Wilson's Plovers aren't faring much better, with a US breeding population of only 8,600 breeding birds. They are a Yellow Watch List species with a global concern score of 16 out of 20. We saw two of them on the beach.

We were very happy to have photographer and park volunteer Roy Lockwood spend some beach time with our photographers, showing them some of his favorite spots. Our photographers had a great time with all the shorebirds and some opportunities for action shots. Thank you Roy!

The weather was lovely. After the beach we walked the Osprey Trail, and although we missed the Eagles this time around, we saw a pair of Great Horned Owls, American Kestrels, Eastern Wood Pewee, and even a migratory Scarlet Tanager. Final Call - Pasco Audubon Tee Shirts





Eight of us walked the main loop at Key Vista Nature Park. We saw 46 species of birds (you can view the list and photos at <u>https://ebird.org/checklist/S151412623</u>) including Great Horned Owl, Whimbrel and Roseate Spoonbill.

October 11th – Holiday Recreation Complex

Eight of us enjoyed a walk around the site on a cooler slightly gray morning, finding 44 species of birds (list at <u>https://ebird.org/checklist/S151950067</u>). Birds seen includes the Nanday and Monk Parakeets, Bald Eagles, American Kestrel, Yellow Warbler and Yellow-throated Warbler.

October 18th – Aripeka Sandhills Preserve

Six of us walked two miles on a cool morning, finding 38 species. While we did not find the migratory warblers we'd hoped to see, we did all see Ovenbirds, a first-of-the-season Wilson's Snipe, and some of us got distant views of a Snail Kite – a rarity here in Pasco (https://ebird.org/checklist/S152564343).

October 25th Lake Blanche Drive/Berry Pick Area

Eight of us got together for this walk – a simple up and down the drive, finding 39 species of birds (<u>https://ebird.org/checklist/S153040527</u>). These included Sedge Wren, just returned for the winter, Roseate Spoonbill and virtually all the wading birds.
