

# Swallowtails to Skippers: the Butterflies of Hernando County By Don Fraser

The presentation will cover most of the species known to still occur in the County, grouped by each of the five families of butterflies found here. It will point out characteristics to differentiate among similar-looking species, and provide life history information on the habitat preferences and general distribution of some of the butterflies found in central Florida, including several very rare ones. Recommendations on resource material for when and where to find butterflies will be provided, as well as tips on how to observe, photograph and identify them, including field guides and available on-line data sources.

Don, our Vice-president for Conservation, is providing this talk for Hernando Audubon on Thursday, October 26, 2023. The meeting begins at 7pm.

#### Bluebird Season Report 2023 by J Mike Kell

2023 was not the best season for our Bluebird boxes. It was a hot dry year throughout the season. Here's an update from each of our locations:

The **Jay B. Starkey Wilderness Park** trail was monitored by **Joanne Laspina** and **Bob Burkhard**, and 5 bluebirds fledged. During the third week in March, vandals struck and destroyed 7 of the Starkey bluebird boxes. Four boxes were installed to replace them as some of those vandalized had not produced eggs or chicks in several seasons.

**Judith Zolo** monitored the box at **Aripeka Sandhills Preserve**, and 4 youngsters fledged. She also monitored the boxes at **Veterans Memorial Park**, where there were 15 fledges. Unfortunately, somebody decided the birds needed food and started stuffing human food in the Bluebird box #2 disrupting the nest in progress with five eggs and the rest of the season. Judith also monitored a **Hudson** box with 7 fledges.

Mary Ellen Gotto monitored boxes at Heartwood Preserve and Trinity College, and they yielded 9 and 8 fledges respectively. Bob Burkhard monitored the boxes at Jack Mitchell Park, where there were 8 fledges from box #2 and box #1 was replaced. JoAnn Sinatra monitored a box in Timber Oaks where 12 bluebirds fledged, and J Mike Kell Monitored the Seven Springs Golf Club box where there were 3 fledges.

In spite of challenges, our Eastern Bluebird boxes helped to enable 71 fledges this season. Thank you to our wonderful volunteer monitors for their care and vigilance throughout the season.

#### Pasco Audubon Tee Shirts Available for Order







# Bird Walk in Cunningham Park by Mike Kell

On a beautiful fall Saturday, the 23rd of Sept 2023, J Mike Kell presented an Introduction to Birding Talk, sponsored and Coordinated by Jayde Archbold of Starkey Ranch Library in Cunningham Park. Ten people had registered with the library and seven were there for the talk. The program began with a basic beginning instruction on how to adjust and use binoculars while bird watching. The park was busy as many people were enjoying the cooler weather. Birds were heard in the trees but few were visible.

A Red-shouldered Hawk called and flew over. I demonstrated using the Merlin app on our smartphones for identifying calls. We also saw or heard a Carolina Wren, Great Egret, Boat-tailed Grackle, Northern Cardinal, Anhinga, crows, and Northern Mockingbird.

I also introduced Pasco Audubon Chapter, our activities, and the schedule.
